*For 2024 consideration, all community goals below must be completed by **Dec. 31, 2024.***

1. Education - Community Risk Reduction Courses

Complete **four** different classes from the list below. Multiple members of a department should complete classes and new department members must attend annually to build depth. Visit [FireSafe.SC.Gov](https://firesafe.sc.gov) for course codes and descriptions. For course credit, provide course name, completion date, and any certificates.

(Note: If multiple people take the same course, it only counts as one of the four required.)

- **NFA and Vision 20/20:** Vision 20/20 Community Risk Reduction for Chief Fire Officers, Vision 20/20 CRR Academy, Any two or six-day NFA Community Risk Reduction Course
- **SC Fire Academy:** Basic Fire Investigation, Fire Investigation First Responder, S.C. Fire & Community Risk Reduction Summit, Fire and Life Safety Educator Quarterly, Fire and Life Safety Educator, Introduction to Sound off with the Home Fire Safety Patrol, Home Safety Visit Train-the-Trainer, NFIRS End-User, NFIRS Administrator, ICC Fire Inspector Test Prep, Fire Codes and Standards Training
- **Self-Paced:** Introduction to Application of Data for Fire and Emergency Services, Introduction to Community Risk Assessment, Introduction to Strategic Community Risk Reduction, South Carolina - Essentials of Community Risk Reduction

2. Establish priority based on specific community risks in your fire district

- Data set used to select population and/or location
- List the approach or intervention used to target the risk in the area
- Provide results of your efforts
- List fire and life safety messages used

3. Data

- Minimum 6 months reporting to NFIRS
- Review the [NERIS FAQ](#)
- Define and share how your department improved data quality this year
- If using a third-party software, learn and share
 - How will they support the change to NERIS
 - How will you access data previously stored in the NFIRS system after transitioning to NERIS

4. Engage and Build Relationships with Community Stakeholders

- Name of community partners
- How does these partners help you reduce community risk
- What type of resources/services have been requested
- Identify quantity of resources/services received (Alarms, Volunteer Hours, Money, etc.)

5. Provide Life Safety Education using Core Four Safety Messages and/or Fire and Life Safety Guides

- Identify groups of your population you focused on with messaging
- Share which messages were promoted
- Identify number of citizens reached
- Report method used to share messaging

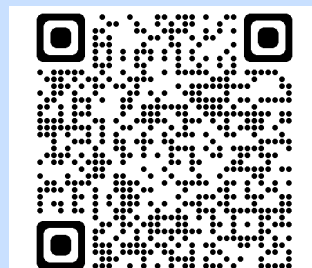

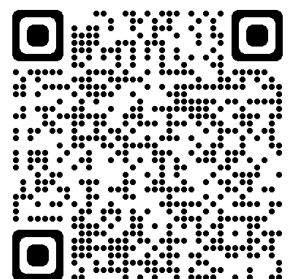

CRR CURRICULUM

There are a number of courses available through the S.C. Fire Academy and our national partners.

Register in the SC Fire Portal using course codes provided.

(6509) Vision 20/20 CRR for Chief Fire Officers

Community Risk Reduction for Chief Fire Officers is Vision 20/20's latest innovative training based on discussions and surveys with CFOs from across the nation. Addressing misconceptions about the true meaning of CRR, this one-day offering builds on difficult discussions, identifying prohibitive cultural aspects of the fire service and best practices that have helped move fire departments toward meeting the challenges of the 21st century. From Battalion Chiefs to Fire Chiefs, this course delivers researched-based information to provide a solid foundation to meet your CRR goals.

(3203) Basic Fire Investigation (by application only)

Each six-day, 48-hour course is designed to cover the basic principles and practices of fire investigation through NFPA 1033-Standard for Professional Qualifications for Fire Investigators and NFPA 921-Guide for Fire and Explosion Investigations. Topics include: Fire scene investigation methodology, scene safety, basic fire science, fire patterns, building systems, electrical systems, appliances, fuel systems, human behavior, origin determination, cause determination, classification of cause, legal considerations, evidence, and documentation

(3209) Fire Investigation for First Responders

This two-day course is designed specifically to provide a clear definition of the role of first responders in fire investigation and provide essential knowledge to enable them to recognize the potential of intentionally set fires, preservation and protection of evidence, and proper reporting of information to appropriate officials. By strengthening the partnership between first responders and investigators, the chances for successfully solving arson-related crimes will increase. The course includes topics such as fire behavior, critical observations of the first responder, fire causes, scene security and evidence preservation, legal considerations, and documentation of findings.

(4165) Fire and Life Safety Educator

This course is designed to take the student to the NFPA 1035, "Standard for Professional Qualifications for Public Fire and Life Safety Educator" level. The course is designed for the individual who will coordinate and deliver comprehensive community fire and injury prevention programs designed to eliminate or mitigate situations that endanger lives, health, property, or the environment. Subjects include: a history of fire prevention education, learning styles, methods for effective teaching, public relations, high-risk populations, professionalism, developing life safety curricula, and evaluation & assessment.

(5241) Fire and Life Safety Educator Quarterly

This course is designed to address the job performance requirements outlined in NFPA 1035 (Fire and Life Safety Educator). In addition to providing continuing education for fire and life safety educators, updates on state programs will be given and there will be an opportunity for professional networking.

(6100) NFIRS-End User Training

Learn how to navigate the modules of fire incident reports, the purpose of NFIRS, how to write a great narrative, and how to gather information regardless of the situation. This class is ideal for those new to NFIRS and a great refresher for experienced users.

(6200) NFIRS-Administrator I

Use your local data to solve your district's fire problem— and learn ways to get from “bad data” to “great data”! This class covers quality control, using web tools, and communication from the field to the report-writing process. This class is recommended for individuals who oversee their department's fire incident reporting process and the most advanced NFIRS users.

(6505) CRR Fire and Community Risk Reduction Summit

The fifth Annual Fire & Community Risk Reduction Summit will bring together local and national industry leaders to provide participants with valuable ideas and resources for targeted fire and life safety risk reduction in their own community. Reduction of fire and life safety risks cannot be done by emergency professionals alone. An engaged and proactive community is necessary for effective risk reduction. Learn from our national and local partners how to reduce the risk of fire and other life safety concerns for you and your community.

(8595) Fire Codes and Standards Training

This four-hour training program will familiarize Fire Marshal candidates with specific rules, regulations, and statutes pertaining to them while operating in South Carolina.

(8612) ICC Fire Inspector Test Prep

State Fire will deliver a four (4) day course designed to assist individuals in preparing for the ICC Fire Inspector I, ICC Fire Inspector II, and ICC Fire Plans Examiner national certification examinations. Note State Fire does not “train to the test”, and success on the ICC Fire Certification Exams will ultimately depend on the individual’s level of preparation, code knowledge, and familiarity with the stated certification exam references.

(8617) The Home Safety Visit Train-the-Trainer

This course will provide the learner with the knowledge to complete a basic community risk assessment. We will discuss the importance of building relationships with community partners. This course also provides an in-depth look at the Fire Safe SC core four safety messages and resources needed to implement home safety visits in the community.

Sound Off with the Home Fire Safety Patrol is a tested and proven approach to fire and life safety education. Join us to learn how the Home Fire Safety Patrol can help students in your community learn how smoke alarms help families stay safe from home fires. Students also learn how to spot and correct common home fire dangers and plan for a fast escape in case a home fire happens. The program supports a community approach to fire safety by forging partnerships among students, families, educators, fire personnel, and life safety educators. Q0494 *Introduction to Application of Data for Fire and Emergency Services*

Introduction to Application of Data for Fire and Emergency Services (IADFES) (Q0494) Serving as an introduction to National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) 5.0, this self-study course provides an overview of the data collection system, its modules, and data conversion issues.

Coding scenario exercises are also included. NFIRS is the comprehensive method for detailed tracking of fire, emergency, and related incident responses.

Q0843 *Introduction to Community Risk Assessment*

Introduction to Community Risk Assessment (ICRA) (Q0843) is a new online self-study course that empowers the learner with a foundational understanding of the components, benefits, and processes of conducting risk assessments. As a prerequisite to the National Fire Academy (NFA) risk reduction program pathway, this course brings all students to the same level of understanding about risk assessments as they progress into more advanced courses. This course uses realistic scenarios to expose students to real-life situations. Students can expect to receive a foundation in vocabulary, working with demographic and community data, and interacting with stakeholders.

Q0841 *Introduction to Strategic Community Risk Reduction*

Introduction to Strategic Community Risk Reduction (ISCRR) is a new online self-study course that empowers the learner with an understanding of what constitutes strategic community risk reduction (CRR). Students explore the history and evolution of fire prevention into all-hazards risk reduction. In addition to identifying the core components that build an effective CRR strategy, students learn how the process can help foster safe, healthy, prepared, and resilient communities.
