2026 FIRE SAFE SOUTH CAROLINA PROGRAM DESIGNATION

Since 2017, Fire Safe South Carolina (FSSC) has partnered with the South Carolina fire service to strengthen community risk reduction (CRR) efforts statewide. Through this unified collaboration, we have worked to reduce fire-related injuries and fatalities, promote consistent life-safety messaging, improve data quality, and provide meaningful resources to support local departments.
