Safety Tips for Children

Step Back

Stay at least 10 feet from the edge of the roadway. Don't approach the bus until it comes to a complete stop.

Be Safe

Don't run or play at a bus stop.

Be Seen

Wear light-colored clothing so that the bus driver and other motorists can see you.

Be Alert

Pay attention to your surroundings. Texting or talking on the phone or using headphones can be dangerous distractions.



Safety Tips for Drivers

Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is getting ready to stop and load or unload children.




Drivers should slow down and prepare to stop.

Red flashing lights with an extended stop sign arm on a stopped school bus indicates children getting on or off.

Drivers should stop behind the school bus.

IN SOUTH CAROLINA, DO YOU KNOW WHEN TO ... STOP FOR A SCHOOL BUS?



When a school bus stops, with flashing lights, on a two lane road (one lane in each direction), drivers on both sides of the road MUST STOP. Drivers must remain stopped until lights on the bus are no longer flashing and the bus is in motion.

When a school bus stops, with flashing lights, on a <u>multilane</u> <u>highway</u>, drivers traveling in the same direction as the bus MUST STOP. Drivers traveling in the opposite direction of the bus may continue driving but should use caution.
