

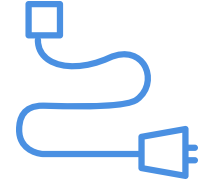
GOLF CART FIRE SAFETY



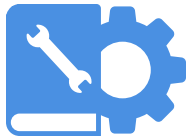
Charge or fuel your golf cart in a well-ventilated area.



Stay home while charging your golf cart. **Never charge overnight.**



Never use a damaged charging cord or extension cord.



Follow manufacturer's instructions for charging and maintaining your golf cart.



Install a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm in your home. **If your alarm sounds, get out and call 9-1-1 immediately.**



Fuel your golf cart when it is cool. **Store** fuel in an appropriate container. **Clean** any fuel spills immediately.



Batteries used in electric golf carts emit hydrogen when charging. Hydrogen is a colorless, odorless, highly flammable gas. Even a small amount of hydrogen can cause an explosion.



Allow a licensed professional to regularly maintain your golf cart.
